



Jon Wallace was an award-winning high school science teacher in Meriden, Connecticut for over 32 years. He has managed the Naugatuck Valley Community College observatory, run many astronomy classes and training sessions, and was an instructor in Wesleyan University's Project ASTRO program. Currently, he is a NASA Solar System Ambassador and is on the Board of the Society of Amateur Radio Astronomers (SARA). As the Education Coordinator for SARA, he has written materials for beginning radio astronomers for the SARA journal and website, including a video on microwave antenna demonstrations and a Software Defined Radio (SDR) project for beginners. In addition, Jon wrote a series of four articles about radio astronomy for QEX magazine which are reprinted, with permission, on the SARA website. Other interests include collecting meteorites, raising

arthropods ("bugs") and insectivorous plants. Jon has a BS in Geology from the University of Connecticut; a Master's Degree in Environmental Education from Southern Connecticut State University and a Certificate of Advanced Study (Sixth Year) in Science (Astronomy) from Wesleyan University. He is living in Maine and gives free presentations in schools, libraries and other venues in the Freeport area.
